We appreciate your interest in National Honor Society. Membership drives occur two times each school year. Juniors and Seniors are eligible to apply in the fall, and all students, including Sophomores, are eligible to apply in the spring. Membership Drives is happening from January 29<sup>th</sup> to February 11<sup>th</sup>. Selection is made from this information packet, so fill it out completely and return it to Mrs. Peterson, in Room E-48, by the end of the day February 11th.

Read through the entire packet and be sure you understand each part. The section labeled "Service Activities" requires signatures and phone numbers so plan ahead. Without the sponsor's signatures and phone numbers, you will receive "0" in this area. (a "0" can prevent your acceptance).

The second page of this packet explains the scoring process for selection. The Faculty Council follows a mathematical formula and those who average 3.7 or above are invited to join, providing they have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.7.

The final page of this packet is the teacher recommendation form. Please give a recommendation form to each of your current teachers as soon as possible so they have adequate time to respond. Teachers are to return the form to Ms. Peterson E-48. If the teacher needs you to return the form please have the teacher put it in an envelope and then seal it. If you need assistance in preparing this packet please visit Room E-48. Membership in NHS is a high honor and a valuable asset in your life.

#### **NHS Induction Selection Method**

An invitation to join National Honor Society is extended to those individuals who excel in scholarship, character, leadership, and service.

The selection method of West Jordan High School is based on a 4.0 point system averaged from points accumulated in the four areas as indicated in the information packet.

- 1. Scholarship: Current cumulative GPA (3.7 minimum) is obtained from the registrar's office by the advisor. (Section I)
- 2. Character: Students ask each of their teachers to complete an evaluation form answering questions relating to character. Teachers rank students on a scale of 1-4 (four being high). The items are averaged for the final score.
- 3. Service & Leadership: Information on these is from the information packet (sections II and III) filled in by the students. One leadership (or service item) gives a 3.5 score and two more give 3.7 to 4.0.

Information packets are evaluated without names by a Faculty Council. Each area is scored and the average of the four scores determines membership. Those who are declined are encouraged to improve their cumulative GPA, involve themselves in more extra-curricular, leadership or service activities to strengthen their possibility for future membership.

Example: Tom has a GPA of 3.85. His teachers rated him 3.72 on character. He has one leadership experience that is 3.5 and he has participated in numerous service activities giving him a 4.0.

GPA 3.85 Character 3.72 Leadership 3.5 Service 4.0

Total 15.07 / 4 = 3.77 total points

Tom would be invited into National Honor Society.
