## **University Credit Guide**

#### **University of Utah**

Students enrolled at the University of Utah who achieved scores of 7, 6, 5 on higher level International Baccalaureate (IB) examinations may be awarded up to eight semester hours of university credit in each higher level examination or **30 semester hours** of credit for the completion of the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

# **Utah State University**

USU recognizes the International Baccalaureate program. Students who enter with International Baccalaureate credit are encouraged to apply to the Honors Program. Students who present an International Baccalaureate diploma will be awarded no more than the number of credits earned with a **maximum of 30 credits**. These credits will waive the appropriate Breadth and Communications Literacy requirements, but students will still be required to complete the Quantitative Literacy requirement, unless individual scores on IB exams waive those requirements. Each student's transcript will be evaluated individually, based on the courses completed.

Students who have not completed the International Baccalaureate diploma may receive **up to 8 credits for scores of 5 to 7 on higher-level exams** (as shown below), up to a maximum of 30 credits.

#### **BYU**

BYU will only award elective college credit for higher level (HL) exams that do not receive GE or specific course credit. Exams that meet this criterion will receive **3 elective credits** for a score of 6 or 7. Awarding of IB credit is exam based and does not take into account the completion of a baccalaureate program. #### UVU

Students may receive up to **3 credits** for scores of 5 to 7 on standard-level exams and **6 credits** for scores of 5 to 7 on higher-level exams, up to a maximum of **30 credits**. Biology, Chemistry, Physics and some Language courses are the exception and can be granted up to 4 credits for scores of 5 to 7 on the standard-level exams and 8 credits for scores of 5 to 7 on the higher-level exams. # **SLCC**

High School students enrolled in an IB program who achieve scores of 5, 6, or 7 on Higher Level International Baccalaureate (IB) Examinations (similar to AP exams) may be awarded up to eight semester hours of credit in each Higher Level exam. Students who complete the IB Diploma earn **30 semester credits**.

## **Southern Utah University**

SUU will grant up to **8 semester credits** to students who receive a score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate Examination or Portfolio. Students who have completed other Higher Level (HL) IB exams with a score of 5, 6, or 7 will receive up to 6 elective credits per exam. (See chart on website)

### **Weber State**

A student who completes the IB Diploma program will receive **30 semester credit hours** and a waiver of all Breadth Requirements (including the Diversity Requirement) contained in the General Education requirements. To further waive the Core Requirements, a student must complete the corresponding Higher-Level Subject with a score of 5 or higher. Students can earn the 30 credits for a diploma or credits for individual subject exams up to 30 credits. (See chart on website)

## **Snow College**

Students who earn scores of 5 or above on Higher Level (HL) or Standard Level (SL)IB Examinations may be awarded up to 8 semester hours of credit for each exam or a total of **30** semester hours of credit for completion of the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

Completion of the IB Diploma will waive General Education requirements with the exception of Composition (English 1010 and 2010), American Institutions (AI), and Quantitative Literacy (QL). These areas may be waived with corresponding Higher Level subject exam scores of 5 or higher. No additional credit will be awarded.

# **Dixie College**

Students completing the IB diploma shall be awarded **30 college credits**, including fulfillment of General Education requirements other than American Institutions, English, and Mathematics.

Students completing the IB diploma may have the General Education requirement(s) in American Institutions, English, and Mathematics waived based on scores of 5, 6, or 7 on the Higher Level (HL) exams. No additional credit shall be awarded.
